

## Installing AutoCAD 2005 on your machine

First, Make sure your machine meets the following requirements:

RAM	256 MB (minimum)	
Video	1024 x 768 VGA with True Color (minimum)	Requires a Windows-supported display adapter.

*You need to be registered to be given a pass through the firewall otherwise you cannot run AutoCAD.*

There are three different installations to choose from. They are as follows:

Full- installs EVERYTHING & then some (runs in Silent mode)

Typical- installs the typical AutoCAD set up (runs in Silent mode)

Custom- Interactive installation allowing the user to choose what items to install

Go to My Network Places, Entire Network, search for computers and type in eecadserv1

You will see three directories, full, custom and typical. Double click on the one that suits your needs.

You will now see a shortcut and a folder. Double click on the shortcut to begin installation. Full & Typical will run silently with no user input required and will install the program to C drive. Custom install is interactive and allows you to specify which drive to install to. You may also want to use Custom install if you have Custom settings you want to preserve. *Make sure you click on the Migrate Custom Settings box during set up.* The program will also write certain files to C drive even though you may have specified a different drive. This is perfectly normal & nothing to be concerned about.

*Please note! This version of AutoCAD will take a while to install. Go grab a cup of coffee!*

All installations will also install a folder containing the JLAB formats. It will be located in \Program Files\AutoCAD 2005\ANSI formats. These formats contain a standard layer set, fonts & line types.
