I, for myself and on behalf of my heirs, assigns, personal representatives and next of kin, **HEREBY RELEASE, IDEMNIFY, AND HOLD HARMLESS JSA/JEFFERSON LAB**, its officers, officials, agents and/or employees, other participants, sponsors, advertisers, and, if applicable, owners and lessors of premises used to conduct the event (RELEASEES), from any and all claims, demands, losses, and liability arising out of or related to any **INJURY, DISABILITY OR DEATH** I may suffer, or loss or damage to person or property, **WHETHER ARISING FROM THE NEGLIGENCE OF THE RELEASEES OR OTHERWISE**, to the fullest extent permitted by law.

- Clean up after yourself; don't leave scraps for someone else to pick-up

Don'ts

- Use government loading equipment, vehicles, or tools to pick-up/remove the scrap wood
