

Thirteen Labs Bring 1,501 Walkers and Runners to Eighth Annual DOE Mile to Set Record Attendance, while Mile Record Times Hold

2023 marked the eighth annual running of the DOE Mile, a one-mile foot race between Department of Energy workers across the country and set record attendance with 1,501 walkers and runners. The race took place on many courses, on different days, time zones, weather conditions and elevations over the course of May. The enduring standards were the distance and the intention to promote health and comradery in the spirit of friendly competition. The DOE Mile continues to bring well over 1,000 lab workers to the starting line. Some seek to stand atop the highest podium, others want a personal best and still others don't care about time and are in it for the fun. While many more stories than those listed here will go unreported, some of the highlights and the results are contained in the following pages.

Sandia National Labs/California Tops Field Over the Four Races Combined Scores

The graph below shows the participation for each lab and the score for each race. The score is the sum of the numerical place finish of the lab's top five finishers in each race. A lab receives a no score (NS) if it has less than five participants in a race. The Event Sum is the sum of the lab's place finishes in the four races. SNL/CA had a sum of 11, making it the top performer over four races in the 2023 DOE Mile.






















SNL/CA is Fastest Lab, JLAB Boasts Highest Participation

Thirteen DOE Labs joined forces to field 1,501 participants in the eighth annual DOE Mile in May, a one-mile walk/run foot race that sparks health and fitness through a friendly competition. The Employee Health Services group at the Sandia National Laboratories California site created and hosted the event, which grows every year and went virtual to survive the Covid-19 pandemic.

Nearly 500 employees and family members participated in the DOE Mile at Jefferson Lab (shown at the start, below). The race was tied to their 36th annual Run-A-Round on the lab campus.

Brett Sanborn Repeats as Fastest DOE Miler Elizabeth Herndon/ORNL Tops Women's Field

Brett Sanborn of Sandia National Labs/NM nipped five seconds from his winning time last year to top the entire field, to win the men's mile in 4:14, and lead SNL/NM to win the men's mile. **Elizabeth Herndon** of Oak Ridge won the women's mile in 5:13.6, stealing the crown from **Sofie Schunk** (SNL/NM) who held it since 2020. LLNL won the women's mile with 42 points, well ahead of CNS Y-12 who finished second with 82 points.

DOE Mile Records Hold

Scott Trummer of Lawrence Livermore holds the men's mile record with a time of 4:02 set in 2020, while **Sofie Schunk** (SNL/NM) set the women's mark in 2022, running a 5:11 mile.

Chelsey Aisenbrey, Director of Performance Management at Ames National Labs, captured the DOE Mile spirit, rallying participants at their race starting line: "The DOE Mile is a highly anticipated annual event. It brings out employees from all areas of the laboratory and provides a mechanism for individuals to interact informally. From my standpoint, this is a tremendous event to reinforce our core value of community."

How the DOE Mile Works

Labs held a one-mile race on their campus over the month of May. The race times from all lab participants were merged to create the overall field. Onsite and "do-it-yourself" options were available this year to accommodate onsite and virtual workers. Family members were invited. A crosscountry running <u>scoring system</u> was used to



determine individual and team/lab scores and placing. Races were scored by assigning a point value for the place in which a participant finished. **The team/lab score is the total of the place numbers of the first five participants.** For example, if members of a team place third, fourth, sixth, eighth and 10th, those numbers are added together to give the team a score of 31 points (3+4+6+8+10=31). The lowest score wins.



A repeat of last year, **Brent Sanborn led SNL/NM** (off the starting line, above) to win the overall race and men's mile. He was followed by lab mate Chris Valicka, in 4:21 for second place. SNL-NM's fifth place runner finished in 17th place, giving SNL/NM a combined score of 36 points. Lawrence Livermore was second with 41 points, and Los Alamos was third with 83 points. The lab scores and place finish for the men's mile is shown below, while the top five for each lab are show at right.

"With the advanced notice of the DOE mile this year, I goaded my fellow Sandia runner friends to run," Brett said, "and thankfully Chris (Valicka) was up for it. I think a lot of people are daunted by doing an all-out mile and don't feel in shape on a given day. Chris and I were able to do a couple of workouts for it this year and that probably helped." It seems the workouts paid off, as both Brett and Chris posted faster times this year.

"I had a blast running the DOE Mile with Brett again

this year – he's a great guy," said Chris, the men's mile silver medalist. "I'm proud of the DOE Mile participation from Sandia and the DOE."

LLNL Takes Silver, LANL Claims Bronze

Lawrence Livermore joined neighbors Sandia California in their onsite race (below), capitalizing on the out-and-back course to win silver in the men's mile with 41 points. Located on the Pajarito Plateau at **7,320-foot elevation**, in the mountains of Northern New Mexico, Los Alamos overcame the decreased oxygen levels to win bronze.

Beth Herndon of Oak Ridge won the women's mile in 5:13.6, taking the title held by SNL/NM's Sofie Schunk for the past three years. Sofie would retain the women's mile record she set in 2022 with a time of 5:11.

"I put on my racing flats and went for the best time I could. I was hoping for the record." – Beth Herndon

"I really enjoy participating in the DOE Mile each year," said Beth. "This year I mapped out a loop in my neighborhood, put on my racing flats, and went after the best time I could. I was hoping for the record but came up a bit short. I also enjoyed cheering on the in-person mile at ORNL!"

Women's Mile Lab Placing: Sum of Top 5 Finishers. LLNL Wins, then CNS Y-12 & SNL/NM

Sofie and colleague Rebecca Schmitt tied for second place in the women's mile in 5:30. "The race was a good day for me, and I ran close to my goal time," said Rebecca, citing a "fun fact that Sofie is my coach and helped me improve my times recently with daily running workouts and strength training." Schmitt stated that Sofie was nursing an injury and would have had a much faster time.

Kelley Ruehl knows how to finish strong, saving her fastest mile of the 26.2-mile <u>Boston</u> <u>Marathon</u> for last, which she ran in 6:54 and submitted for the DOE Mile. The time placed her 14th overall and first for SNL/CA.

"This is my second time running Boston," said Kelley. "My first time was in 2019, but this year was especially significant. It was the 10-year anniversary of the Boston Marathon

bombing, and it was personally the result of a fouryear journey back to the Boston Marathon post-ACL surgery. I ran Boston in April 2019, tore my ACL in May 2019 (it went undiagnosed for months), got surgery in October 2019, qualified for Boston in June 2022 and ran Boston in April 2023.

"The Boston Marathon is unlike any other race. The whole city shuts down to cheer for the runners, and the energy is extraordinary. You can hear the Wesley scream tunnel more than a mile away, and you can feel it when you run through it. For me the race had many layers of significance, and I can honestly say that I started and ended the race with tears of joy."

Sarah says she plans to start her final push earlier next year to see if she can finish under 12 minutes.






DOE Mile Montage rotating clockwise from upper left. 1 mile course marked, recording of result start and finish.
