

Nikos Sparveris received a Diploma in Physics (1996), a M.S. in nuclear and particle physics (1998) and a Ph.D. (2002) from the University of Athens. He was a postdoctoral research associate at the Institute of Accelerating Systems & Applications in Athens, Greece and a senior postdoctoral associate at MIT before joining the Temple University Physics Department as an Assistant Professor in 2010 by accepting a joint faculty position between Temple U. and Jefferson Lab. He became an Associate Professor in 2017. He has served as the thesis advisor of five Ph.D. students that conducted their thesis experiments at Jefferson Lab. He has led a number of experimental efforts in electron-scattering facilities around the world, he has served as a spokesperson to three Jefferson Lab experiments and he has co-authored over 100 papers in peer-reviewed journals. He has received the Peter Demos award from the MIT Bates LAC and the Pythagoras Fellowship from the Hellenic Ministry of Education.
